## National Assessment Collaboration (NAC) Physician Examiner recruitment requirements



- 1. Physicians must meet all the <u>Common Physician Examiner and Physician Marker recruitment requirements</u> for all Medical Council of Canada (MCC) exams.
- Physicians must have the Licentiate of the MCC (LMCC) and must provide their LMCC registration number.

## OR

Physicians who do not have their LMCC will be accepted as examiners under the following conditions:

a. They assume a faculty position at a university (e.g., faculty lecturer, assistant professor, associate professor, or professor).

## AND

- b. They hold certification by one of the following organizations and provide their certification number:
  - i. Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC)
  - ii. Collège des médecins du Québec (CMQ)
  - iii. College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC)

## AND

- c. They sign a Release and Waiver document indicating that they have no intention of taking the NAC Examination, if requested at the discretion of the MCC.
- 3. Physicians must have recent experience supervising clerks or postgraduate year 1 (PGY1) residents or they must have experience as an examiner at this level of training.
- 4. Physicians may be community physicians (i.e., they do not need to be faculty members if all other criteria are met).
- 5. Physicians must be currently practising medicine in Canada; if they are a resident physician, they must be PGY3 residents or higher or have their Certificate of the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CCFP) at the time of the examination.
- 6. If retired, physicians must be within three (3) years of practising in Canada.
- 7. Physicians must not have been engaged in, nor will become engaged with, the creation, development, or delivery of for-profit preparatory courses or programs related to any of the MCC exams.

Any exceptions require approval by the Assessment Department team.

Documentation of qualifications may be requested.
